
The start – From Predictive Policing to Preventive Policing in Partnership

- Start focus Area: Predictive Policing & High Impact Crime (HIC)
- CAS (Crime Anticipation System), PreMAP (Germany), etc.
- Systems not really used at police work floor
- Predictive Policing: ethical, legal and social problems
- Police only system (police info in -> police action out)
- There is more info available from other stakeholders + more action

In short: predictive policing sucks

"...Really looking at which stakeholder can best intervene.
Who has the best info and perspective for action... "

Implementation - exploitation



National Implementation workshops – Q3+Q4 2021 (several dates)

► Leiden University have integrated ProHIC into their curriculum for the MSc Criminology (2021 and beyond: 2022, 2023 etc.)



- ➤ 30+ master students Leiden (future end users)
- ► 6 groups of students learned how to use the ProHIC approach (Manual, Book of Basics, Website, Pearls) and implemented ProHIC in 6 different cities to different HIC issues and were supervised by university, DSP, practitioners from police and municipality
- Six different groups scanned, analysed and planned action for six cities (and 6 different types of High Impact Crime)
- See plan to tackle problems with robberies of shops/stores (following the ProHIC approach)





Implementation/exploitation


- Distribution of Book of Basics (Q3, Q4 and 2022 etc.)
 - Available online (English and Dutch version, including hyperlinks)
 - Published through Boom criminology (English edition by Eleven)
 - Most renowned publisher in criminology in The Netherlands





Implementation/exploitation

- Distribution of tool via Pearls of Knowledge
 - 2.000+ multi-disciplinary experts
 - ▶ 400 Pearls on the website (+3 pearls a week and still counting)
 - ► 60.000 downloads since start
 - Pearls used by police, justice, municipalities, academia and security industry







Exploitation



Avans University of Applied Science integrate ProHIC into their curricula for students (150+ students Integrale Veiligheidskunde) (Following Leiden University learning ProHIC and using it in 6 neighbourhoods in 's Hertogenbosch, February 2022).










2022: SBO commercial professional training CPD (end users)

- ➤ 2022: Police Academy (end users) use the ProHIC tool in the new education program *Integrale Vervolg Opleiding Opsporing* (IVOO) starts Q3 2022 Apeldoorn
- ▶ Book of Basics, Manual, Pearls, Website are part of the physical/ digital libraries for all students (Police Academy + Universities)





Opportunities for Further Exploitation



2022-2026: Several cities want to integrate ProHIC in their HIC approach



 Next to Leiden, Avans, InHolland more universities are interested in ProHIC (e.g. Hogeschool van Amsterdam)



Some Dutch prosecutor's offices have reached out to the ProHIC team and shown an interest in integrating the ProHIC approach in their future planning
















Old City Hall in Gouda

Gouda is a middle sized city with 75.000 inhabitants

The other side of Gouda: very high rates of burglary in the past

| Number of police reports in 2016 | |
|---|----------------------------------|
| City of Gouda | 20 burglaries per 1000 dwellings |
| Police district (wider area including e.g. city of The Hague) | 8 burglaries per 1000 dwellings |

Police and Municipality started a project to reduce burglary – using the SAPE method









STEP 1 Scanning and prioritisation


Scanning

- Determine whether there are (major) problems with HIC in your municipality and what the consequences are. Use the following as input:
 - · Police data (portal, scan, early warning).
 - · Weigh up the levels of seriousness.
 - If necessary, make a broader assessment of the total picture of local crime in the municipality (on the basis of conversations with key people or a periodic survey among residents).
- Especially look at concentrations: Hot times Hot places / Hot spots Hot shots Hot victims (population and organisations).
- Indicate roughly what should be achieved with regard to this problem by citizens/institutions/companies, the municipality, the police and the Public Prosecutor (OM).
- Choose one or more of the cited problems (prioritisation) and analyse them in the next step (analysis).





Scanning in Gouda; 7 neighbourhoods of Gouda



Result: Focus on the Neighbourhood Goverwelle.






CRIME TRIANGLE

There are several methods for analysing the crime problem.

Gouda used one of them, the double crime triangle







Crime triangle – 3 tasks

We will divide tasks for the different groups

TASK 1: analysing offenders: which methods would you use?

TASK 2: analysing objects/victims: which methods would you use?

TASK 3: analysing situation: which methods would you use?





Analysis by the police in Gouda

Two sources of information: police data



Interviews with stakeholders: representatives of municipality, Youth care, Youth work, Housing associations and residents



Results

| Results problem analysis Domestic burglary in Goverwelle | | | |

| Offenders | Significant share of repeat offenders, including members of criminal families. Simpel modus operandi | | |
| Objects/ victims | Limited home security. Repeated victimization. Mainly single-family homes and especially aged 45-65 | | |
| Situation | Many burglaries via poorly lit back alleys. Polarization and very little social control. Polarization between native residents and immigrant residents | | |





Analysis by the police in Gouda

What did they really do in Gouda/Goverwelle?

Offender oriented

- Young offender hotshots approach for top offenders: punish directly, help if needed, prevetion focuss also on brothers/sisters (BroSis approach)
- Criminal families: Repression for leaders and core individuals. Support for motivated non criminal family members (together with health experts), relocate and disperse (if possible), protection of young children together with 'SAFE Home' experts)

Victim oriented

- Publicity and training about burglary prevention
- Subsidising burglary resitant doors and windows (following requirements as set by Police label Safe and Secure Housing and Building Code for new to build houses (since 2000)

Situational/CPTED

- See also: victim oriented
- Better lighting in the neighbourhood
- Gates closing down the back alleys (alley gating)

Citizens' participation

- Community workers
- Neighbourhood prevention team
- Neighbourhood booth
- Neighbourhood/community meeting and activities
- Use of (social) media and publicity


Results

Number of domestic burglaries

| | 2016 | 2017 | 2018 | 2019 |
|------------------------------------|------|------|------|------|
| Goverwelle | 160 | 130 | 61 | 53 |
| Index 2016-2019 | 100 | 81,3 | 38,7 | 32,4 |
| Gouda (without Goverwelle) | 23,4 | 18,0 | 12,7 | 9,5 |
| Index 2016-2019 | 100 | 76,9 | 54,3 | 40,6 |
| District The Hague (without Gouda) | 7,5 | 6,0 | 4,9 | 4,6 |
| Index 2016-2019 | 100 | 80 | 65,3 | 61,3 |

Conclusions:

- Strong decrease in number of domestic burglaries in Goverwelle
- Decrease in number of domestic burglaries in Gouda
- The decrease in number of domestic burglaries in Gouda and Goverwelle is stronger than in the wider police district area (The Hague)



Conclusions:

- Strong increase in the number of solved cases of domestic burglaries in Gouda
- The number of solved cases of domestic burglaries in the district of The Hague remains the same





Is there displacement effect to other types of crime?
