Two papers make up the EUCPN toolbox on high-risk victim groups (available in English, French, German and Czech):

- Preventing repeat and secondary victimisation: examines which groups of people can be
 considered as high-risk victim groups due to their personal susceptibility characteristics
 and discusses how the victim-centred approach as well as multi-agency cooperation can
 play a role in preventing secondary victimisation. Furthermore, it focuses on breaking the
 cycle of repeat victimisation by encouraging victims' reporting behaviours, referring them
 successfully to other support services and assisting them during a potential court trial.
