### **Sweden: Risk Reduction Intervention**

The method consists of a combination of risk assessments, conversations with the perpetrators and protection and support for the victims. It had the greatest impact in cases involving particularly vulnerable crime victims, such as domestic violence, stalking, crimes against personnel exposed because of their profession, ...



### **The Netherlands: HackShield Future Cyber Heroes**

An educational game that trains children aged eight to twelve to become Cyber Agents who protect themselves and their environment against the dangers of the online world and learn how to seize opportunities in the online world. By playing through various levels, children learn about cyber security subjects.



### **Denmark: Systematic Forensic Medical Screening of Children in Cases of Suspected Physical Violence**

A procedure ensuring that children were offered a forensic medical examination following the video-recorded investigative interview. Objective medical evidence is documented alongside the child's verbal description of abuse, and the child's general health status is screened.

## Toolbox on high-risk victim groups



Two papers make up the EUCPN toolbox on high-risk victim groups:

- Preventing repeat and secondary victimisation: examines which groups of people can be considered as high-risk victim groups due to their personal susceptibility characteristics and discusses how the victim-centred approach as well as multi-agency cooperation can play a role in preventing secondary victimisation. Furthermore, it focuses on breaking the cycle of repeat victimisation by encouraging victims' reporting behaviours, referring them successfully to other support services and assisting them during a potential court trial.
