Objectives of the project

Primary goal: prevention of victimization

- Awareness- raising on human trafficking, prostitution, domestic violence
- Information on risks factors and signs of danger and on the possibilities to get help (where to turn to for help)
- Change attitudes towards the addressed problems



Objectives of the project

Secondary goal:

- Reaching school staff, teachers and make them receptive and sensitive for the addressed topics
- Train experts to be able to conduct effective prevention lessons



Frames of the project

- Budget: The project was financed by the Ministry of Human Resources with a budget of 12.813 EUR.
- Duration: 15/12/2013- 31/10/2014
- Main target group: vocational school students (age group: 14-18)
- Secondary target group: teachers, school staff



Project activities

- 2 day training organised for the staff of crisis treatment centers
- Implementation of prevention lessons and trainings in vocational schools for teenagers
- Risk assessment of the participant students
- Impact assessment: evaluation of the effectiveness of the programme


Creation of promotional materials for teachers and students

 Accreditation of the prevention programme by the National Institute for Health Development




VISCERVEZET Some results of the risk assessment

I have received a friends request/invitation to chat on social networking sites, Facebook, or in chat rooms from unknown people who soon invited me to a party or offered a job.











I have already offered a job that was said to make a lot of money easily, or extraordinary salary without any requirement of education or specialised knowledge.






It happened to me that I didn't have any memory of a party the next day even though I hadn't drunk that much.





It happened to me that I was accosted on the street by an older man/woman with the aim to have a longer conversation.







- 1536 students were reached
- The impact assessment shows that 81% of participants increased their knowledge
- Significant changes were achieved in the knowledge of 42% of participant students



Conclusions

- Even though at least one third of teenagers are affected by abuse within their family, or exposed to risk factors of prostitution and human trafficking, their knowledge about the signs of danger or help organisations is often missing.
- These experiences underlie the importance of the prevention work in schools and the need for further programmes that allow an even deeper understanding of addressed topics.
