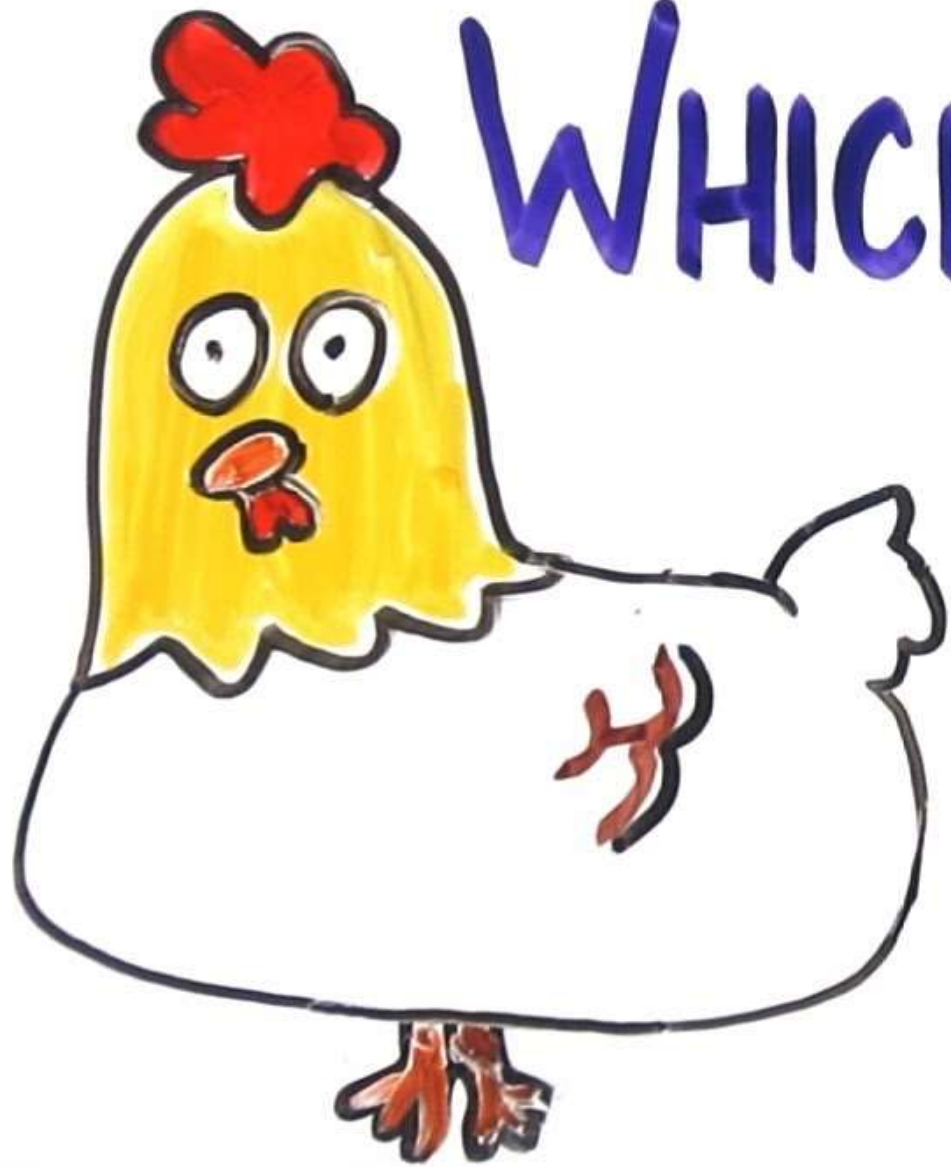

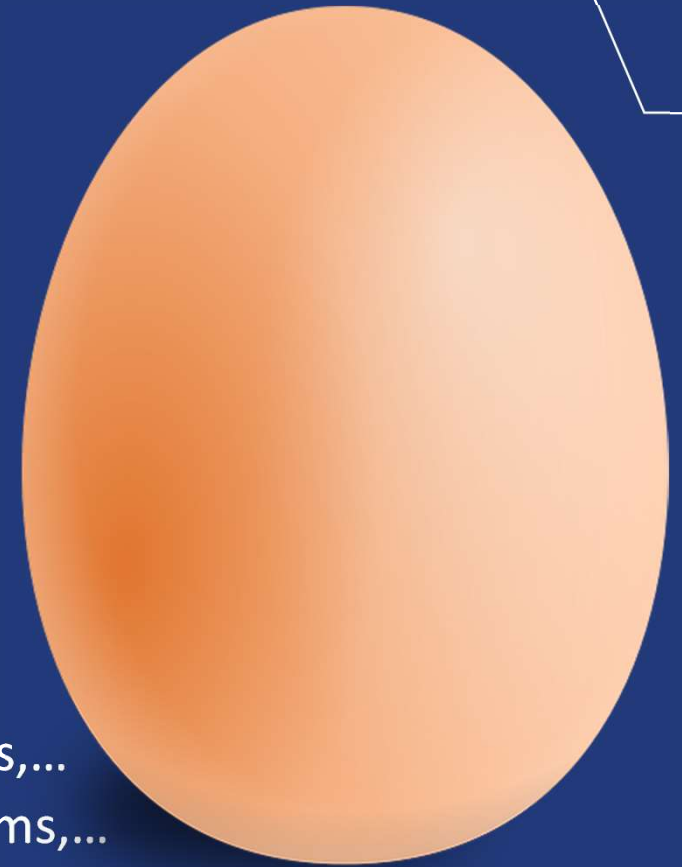

01 Chicken or the egg

- No signs of problematic behaviour
- Risk & protective factors
 - ! Common set
 - Family: family history, parental attitudes,...
 - School: academic failure, lack of commitment,...
 - Peers and individuals: rebelliousness, deviant friends,...
 - Community: availability of substances, laws and norms,...
- Traditional prevention

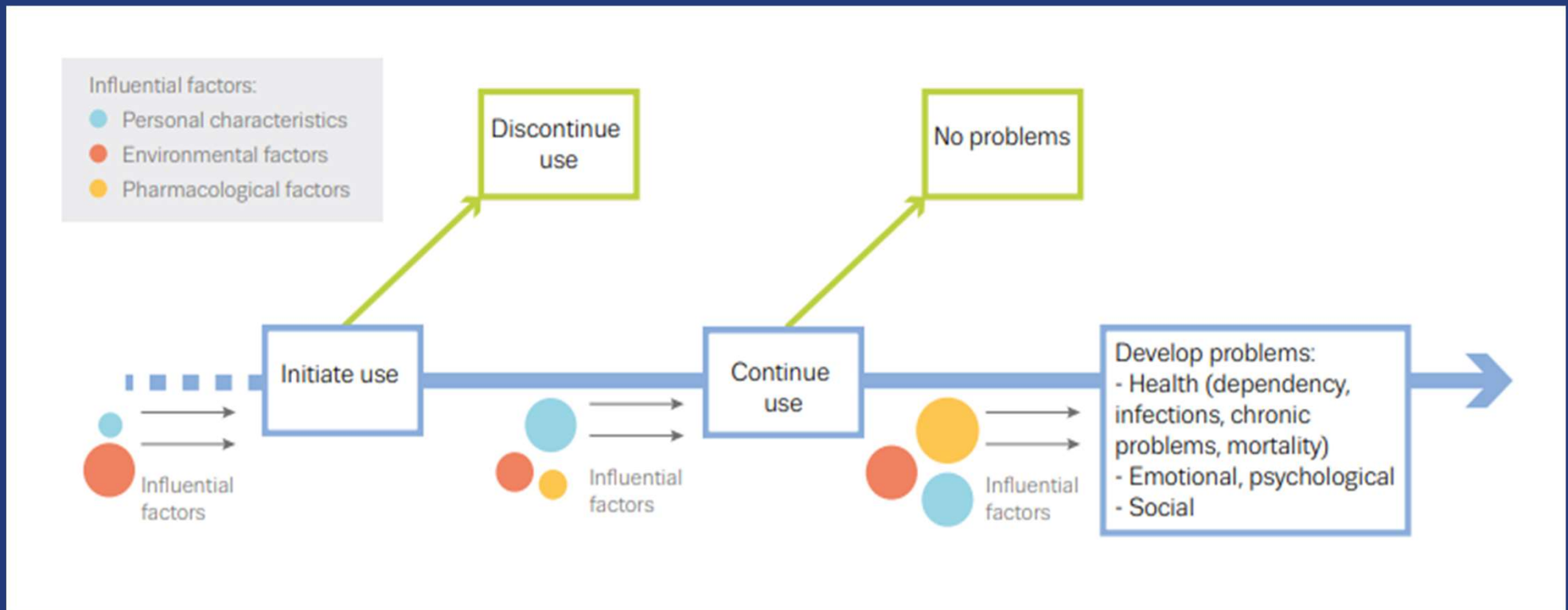


01 Chicken or the egg

 - Treatment

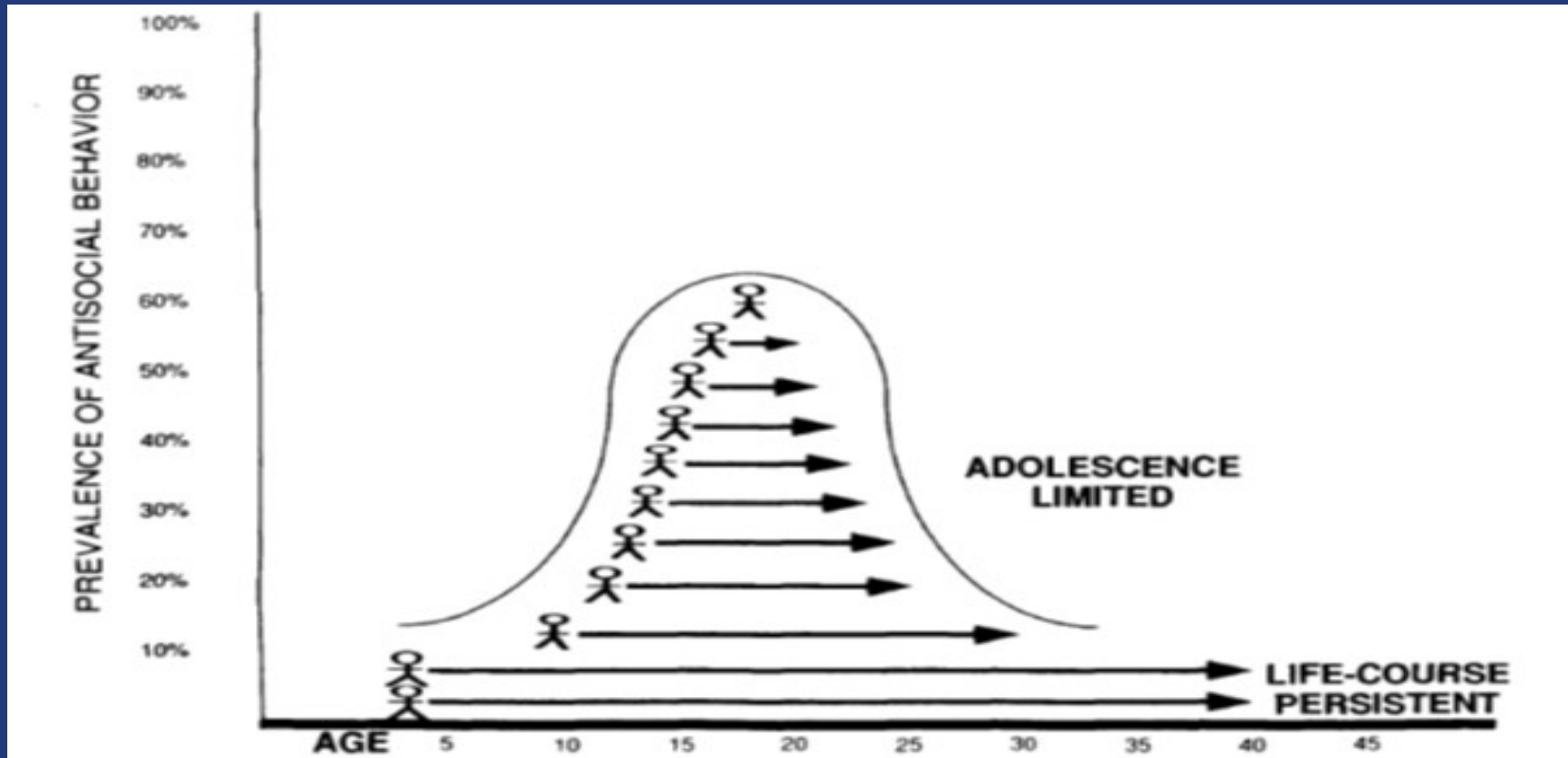
