| Relevant legislation: | <p>Government Decision 271/2013 for the approval of the Romanian Cyber Security Strategy and the National Action Plan for the implementation of the National Cyber Security System</p> <p>The purpose of Romanian cyber security strategy is to define and maintain a secure virtual environment, with a high degree of resilience and confidence, based on national cyber infrastructures, which constitute an important support for national security and good Government, to maximize the benefits of the citizens, business environment and Romanian society.</p> <p>Romania's cyber security strategy sets out the objectives, principles and major actions for understanding, preventing and counteracting cyber threats, vulnerabilities and security risks and to promote Romania's interests, values and national objectives in cyberspace.</p> <p>The Strategy establishes the following objectives:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> a) to adapt the legal and institutional framework to the dynamics of specific cyber threats; b) to establish and implement minimum secure requirements and profiles for National cyber infrastructures, relevant in terms of the correct functioning of the critical infrastructure; c) to ensuring the resilience of the cyber infrastructure; d) to ensure the security through understanding, preventing and countering vulnerabilities, risks and threats to the cyber security of Romania; e) to take advantages of the cyber opportunities in order to promote the national interests and goals in cyberspace; f) to promote and develop cooperation between the public and private sectors at national, as well as the International cooperation in cyber security; g) to develop the culture of security by raising awareness of the population to vulnerabilities, risks and threats from cyberspace and the need to ensure protection of their information systems; h) to active participate to the initiatives of international organizations in the field of defining and establishing measures for increasing international confidence in cyberspace use. |
